Teachers and students can create a free web page or site! Weebly.com is a free tool for teachers and students and is a wonderful means of communicating with parents, students and the community.

You can setup an account in only a few minutes by visiting education.weebly.com. After creating an account, enter your User Name and Password.



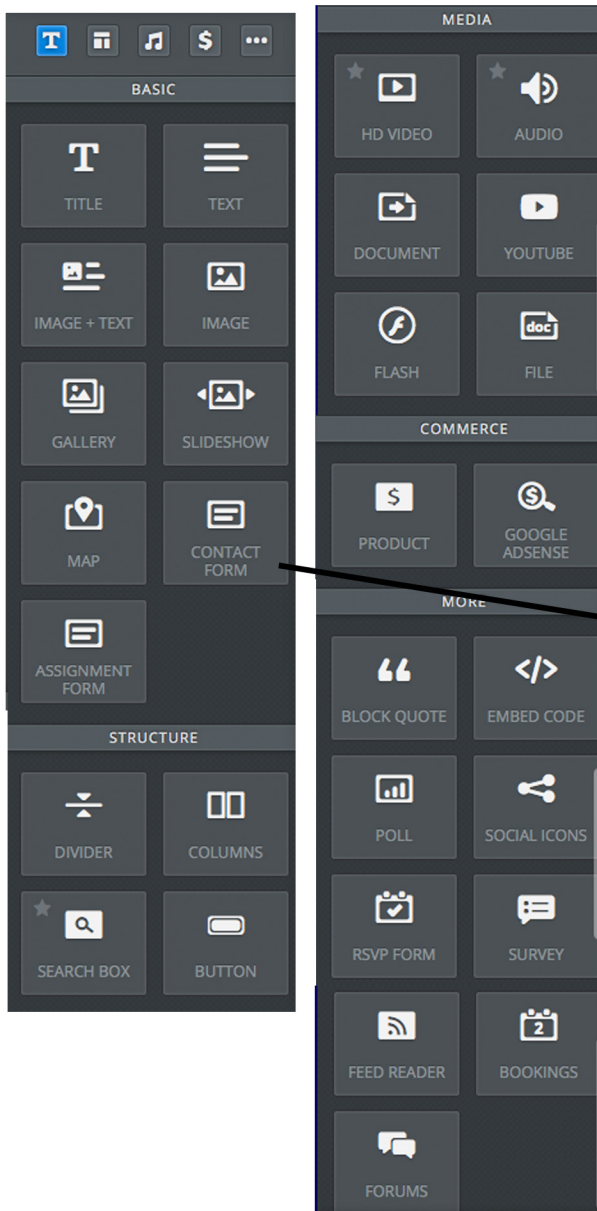
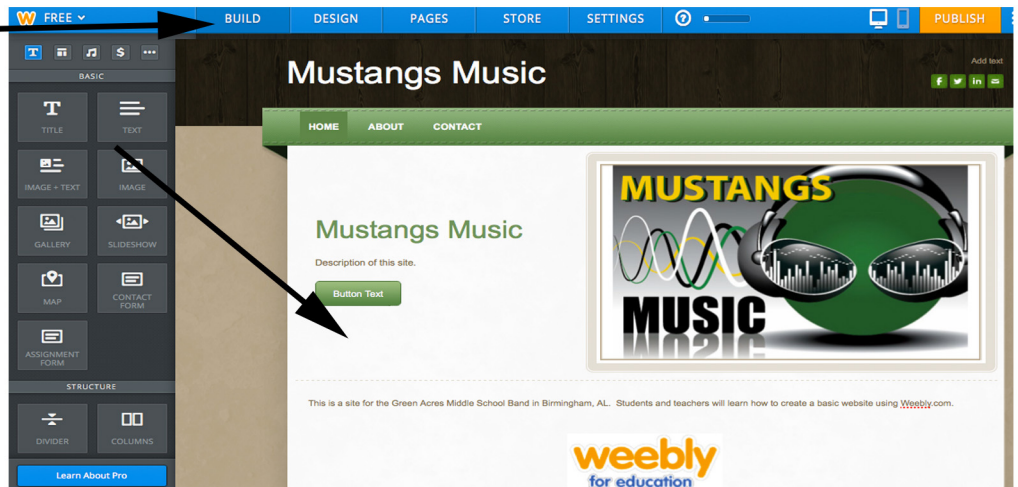


Starting your site, blog or online store on Weebly is surprisingly easy. Our powerful drag & drop Site Creator has everything you need to create a high-quality site.

There are many tutorials on Weebly to help you get started with your site.

There are numerous buttons on the left side to insert items into your site. Choose the Title or Text button. Drag the button to the place where you will type. Type information into the box. You can always edit, move or delete the boxes as needed.

- 1) Build Tab
- 2) Title / Text
- 3) Drag to place the item
- 4) Type your information



Weebly has added many new features and elements to their site recently. Besides adding text and images, you can add slideshows, maps, assignment and contact forms, surveys, files and other media. All of the elements are free unless there is a star next to it. The Pro account is needed to use additional features.

Continue to drag-and-drop elements from these buttons to design your websites.

- 1) Design Tab
- 2) Change fonts, colors and theme elements.

It is best to have dark font colors (black) on a light background and light font colors (white) on a dark background so your site can be read easily.

- 1) Pages Tab
- 2) Select 'Add Page' to create additional pages for your site.

Pages will appear as a new tab on most themes (a link to the page).

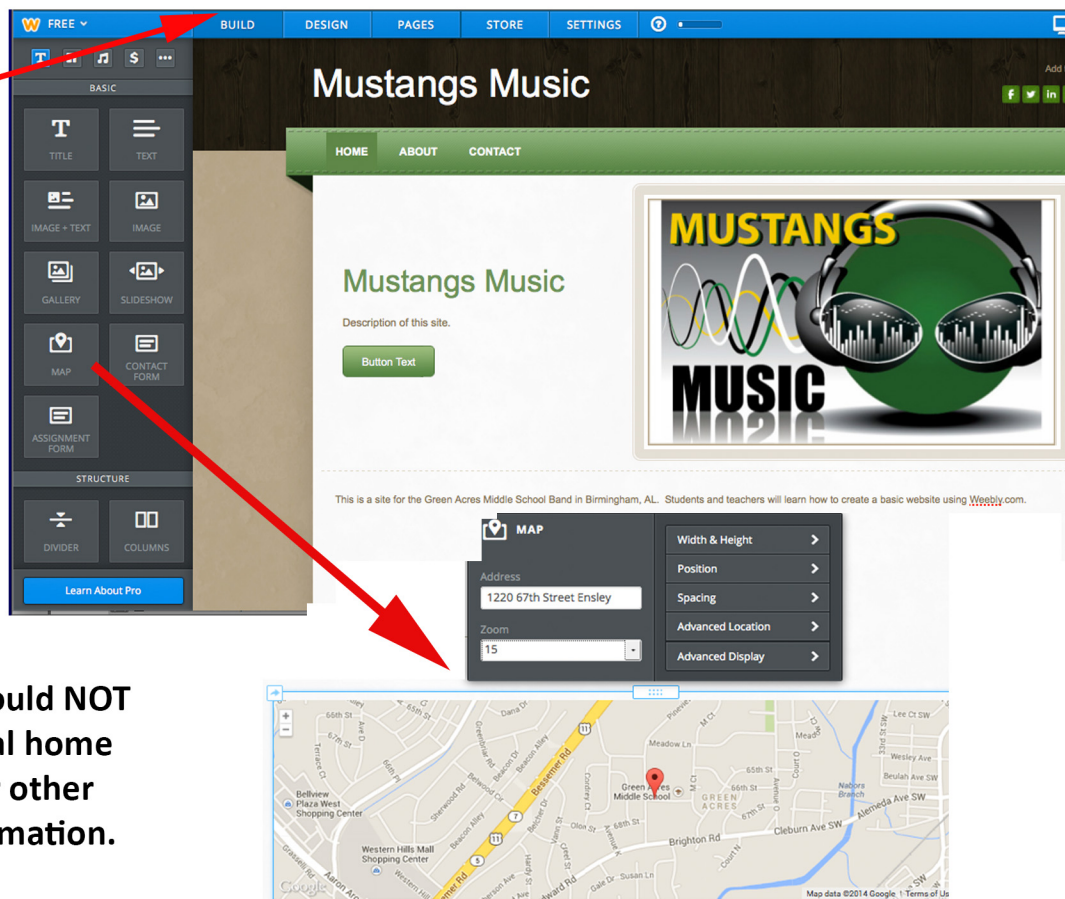
Select 'Save & Edit' to work on the page.

- 1) Settings Tab
- 2) Changes information, passwords and other details about your site.

For educational purposes, do not use the Facebook sharing and other social sites, unless needed.

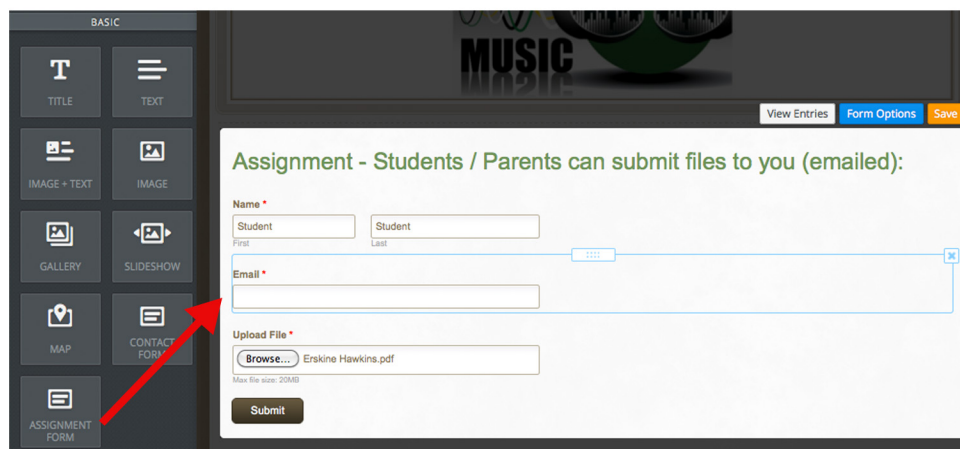

- 1) Build Tab
- 2) Select Map
- 3) Drag to place the map
- 4) Type your map location



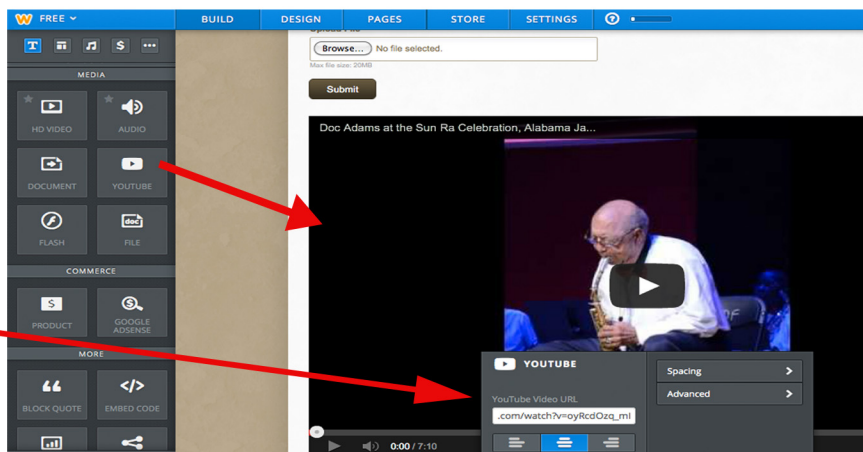
Students should NOT post personal home addresses or other private information.

Teachers can create assignment forms through the site for collecting student work or projects.

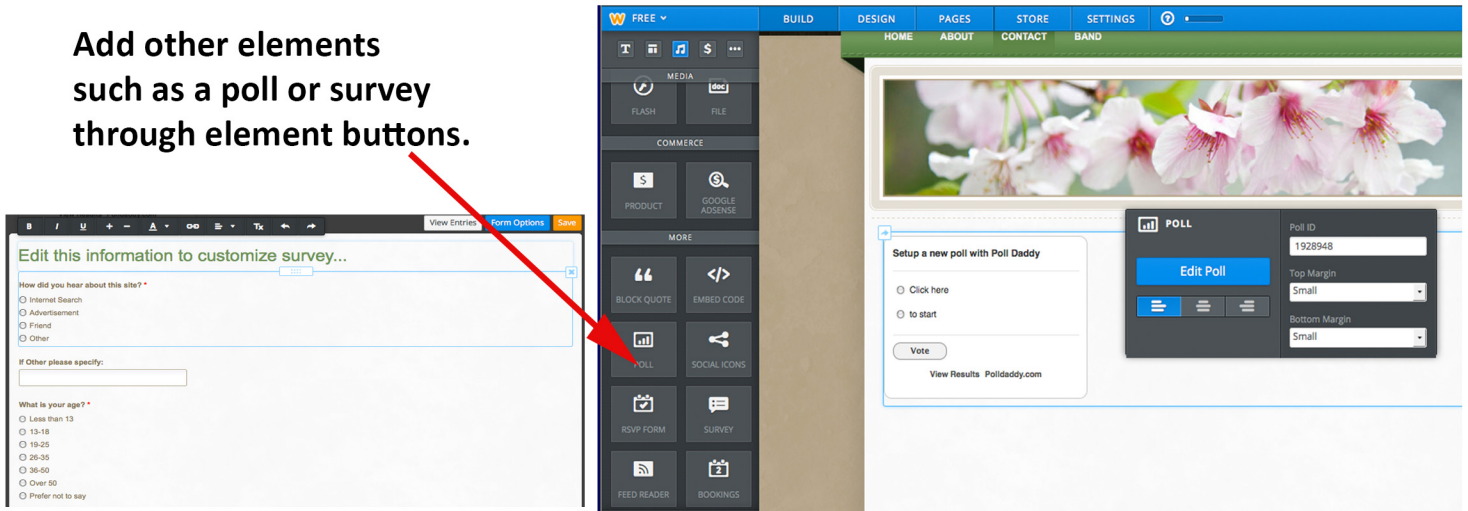


Insert a link to a YouTube page by dragging the element to the web page.

Copy the link from YouTube and paste it into the box (YouTube Video URL).

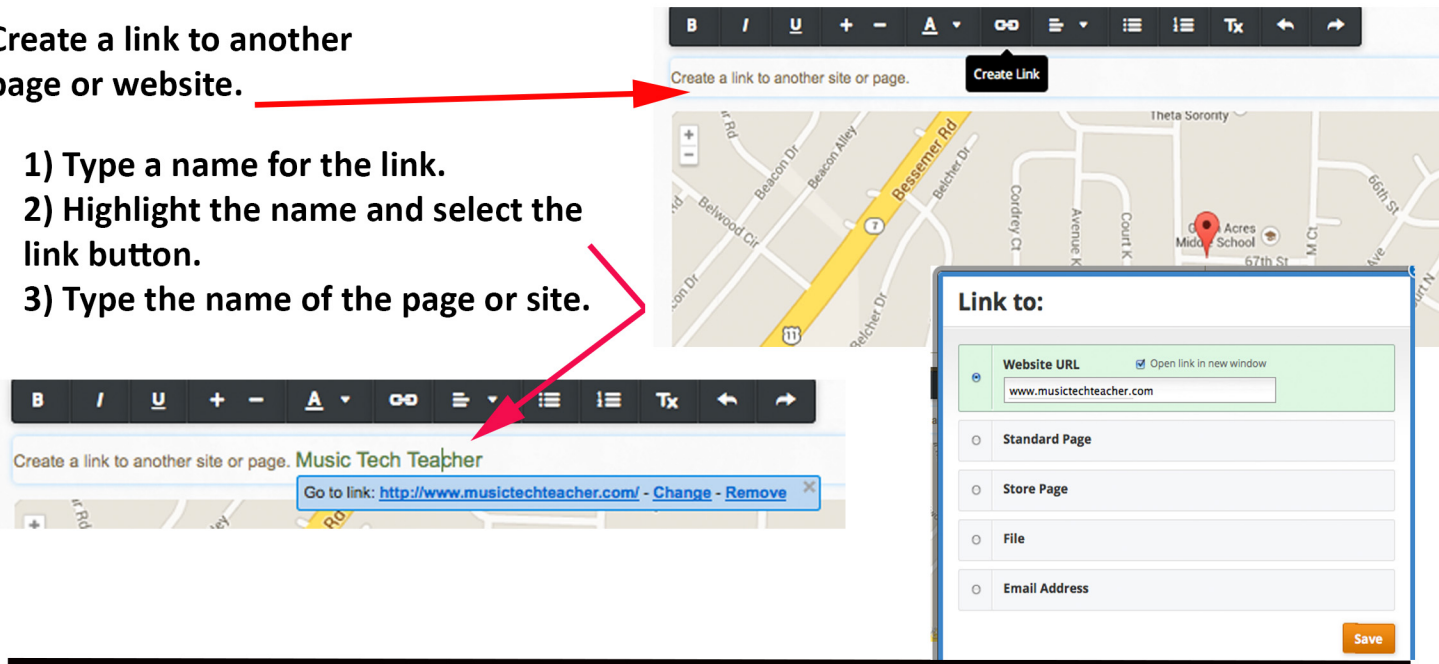


Add other elements such as a poll or survey through element buttons.

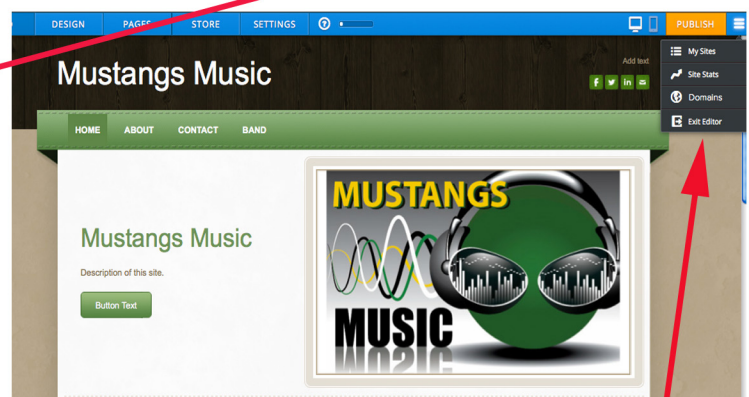


Create a link to another page or website.

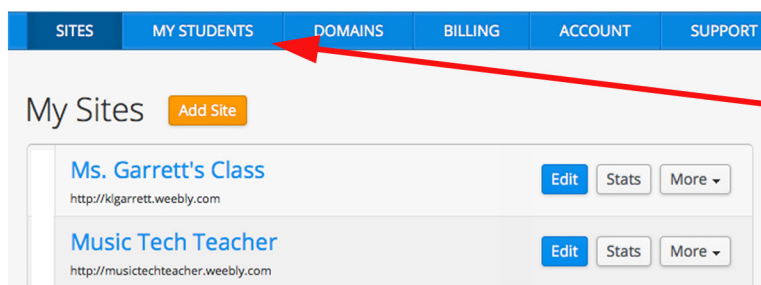
- 1) Type a name for the link.
- 2) Highlight the name and select the link button.
- 3) Type the name of the page or site.



Publish your site on the Internet. Select Publish and the free version of the site.

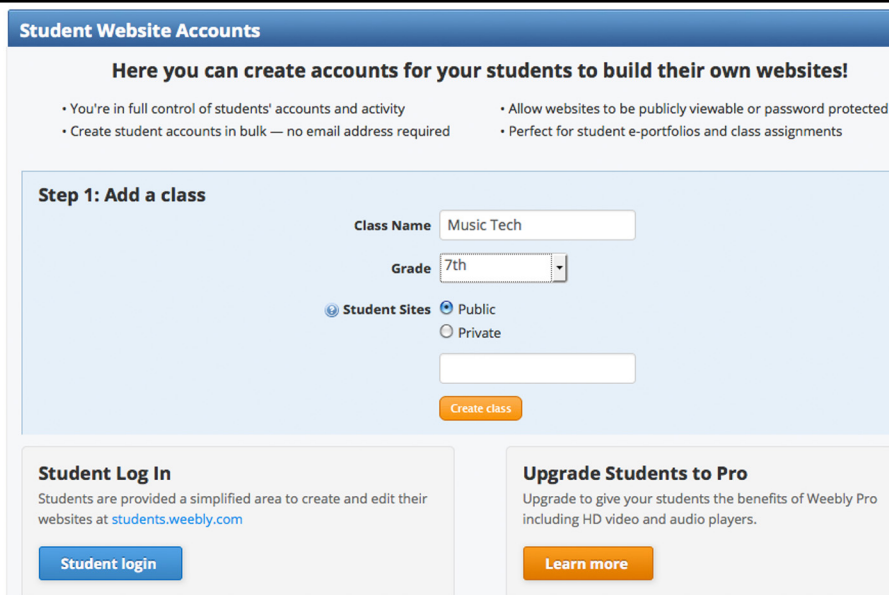
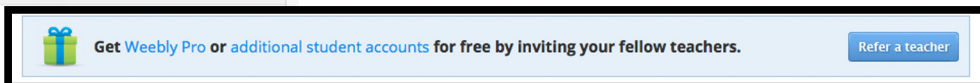


Select Exit Editor and Logout on the next screen. If you do not logout, someone may change or delete your website.

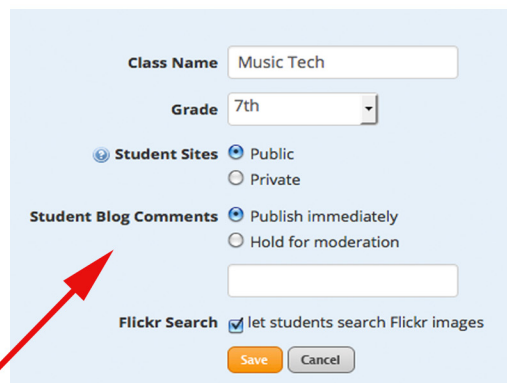
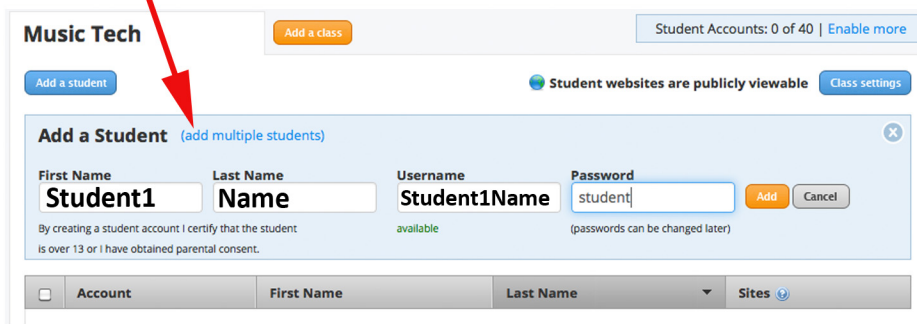


Create accounts for your students from the main account page.

- 1) Add a class
- 2) Select a grade
- 3) Select Public or Private



- 4) Enter student name and password
- 5) Click 'Add Student'



You can hold the student work for moderation before it is posted on the Internet through your account.

- Students under the age of 13 should have permission from their parents before creating a site. Sites can be 'private' so others could not see it on the Internet without a password. Student sites are created and published like Educators' sites.
- Do not post full names or information about students.
- Do not give students your Educator password, as they can access the site anytime without supervision.
- All of the information posted in projects and on the sites should be done in a positive and professional manner as it is a reflection of our school.
